1. Who benefits from our work?

The primary beneficiaries of Developing Medicine are:

People living in developing countries, conflict zones, and disaster-affected regions who lack access to basic healthcare.

Displaced persons, refugees, and migrants (specifically in regions like the Darién Gap, Sri Lanka, and Ethiopia).

Healthcare professionals and community health workers in resource-poor settings.

Members of the public seeking accessible, high-quality medical education in their native languages.

2. What is the benefit?

The benefits we provide are the advancement of health and the advancement of education. We achieve this by:

Direct Medical Relief: Providing essential medical equipment, supplies, and financial grants for treatment, which directly saves lives and alleviates suffering in areas where healthcare infrastructure is failing or non-existent.

Accessible Education: Developing and distributing free, evidence-based digital medical training. By translating these resources into local languages, we empower local practitioners and the public with life-saving knowledge that is otherwise inaccessible due to cost or language barriers.

Systemic Improvement: Supporting local clinics and NGOs through grants and resources, strengthening the long-term healthcare capacity of the communities we serve.

3. Are there any restrictions on who can benefit?

No. Our services are provided based on need and vulnerability. We do not discriminate based on race, religion, gender, or political affiliation. All our digital educational resources are provided free of charge to ensure that poverty is not a barrier to accessing life-saving information.

4. Is there any private benefit?

Any private benefit (such as training provided to an individual healthcare worker) is purely incidental to our charitable aim of improving the health of the wider community. No trustee or related party receives any private benefit from the charity's activities, other than the reimbursement of out-of-pocket expenses as permitted by our constitution.
